Hot & Cold – Stay Safe at Work!

Hot Weather Safety

- 1 Drink one cup (150-200 ml) of cool water every 15-20 minutes.
- 2 Rest in shaded, well-ventilated areas.
- 3 During the hottest hours (typically 2–5 PM), stop work or take longer, more frequent breaks.





Cold Weather Safety



- Wear proper cold-weather gear such as insulated hats. boots, gloves, and thermal underlayers.
- 2 Warm up regularly in a designated heated rest area.
- 3 Drink warm water or lightly sweetened warm beverages to maintain body temperature.

Pre-Entry Safety for Confined Spaces

Before entering confined spaces (tanks, manholes, septic tanks, storage tanks, ship interiors), verify atmospheric safety:

> (Oxygen (O₂): 18-23,5% / Hydrogen Sulfide (H₂S): Below 10 ppm Carbon Monoxide (CO): Below 30 ppm Flammable Gas: Below 10% of the Lower Explosive Limit (LEL)



















Safe Work Practices Work in teams of two or more to monitor each other's safety.

If a coworker collapses inside a confined space, do NOT enter without proper respiratory protection. Unprotected rescuers may also lose consciousness.






What Is an Industrial Accident?

An industrial accident refers to death, injury, or occupational illness that occurs when a worker is exposed to work-related hazards—such as structures, machinery, equipment, raw materials, gas, steam, or dust-during the performance of their duties.

How Industrial Accidents Occur

Major Types of Accidents

Slips/Trips: Wet floors, poor housekeeping Falls: Working at height without a safety harness Caught-in/Between: Hands caught in operating machinery

Other Hazards: Fire, electric shock, collisions, etc.


Industrial Safety Wear Inspection
